## **Guidelines for Authors**

Manuscripts submitted for publication in the *Journal of Bamboo and Rattan* should not have been published or submitted for publication elsewhere. All manuscripts of research articles, review papers and short communications will be subject to peer review. Manuscripts found unsuitable in terms of the requirements of the journal will not be processed further. Illustrations and other materials, reproduced from other publications, must be properly credited for. Authors have to agree to permit publication of accepted papers under a user license equivalent to the CC-BY 4.0 license by Creative Commons. Manuscripts may be sent by email as attachment to the Chief Editor, Journal of Bamboo and Rattan at jbr@kfri.org.

## Form of manuscripts

The manuscript should be divided into separate files: text, line drawings, figures, figure legends, tables, references, etc. Footnotes and cross references should be kept to the minimum. Do not justify the right-hand margin. Names of genera and species should be italicized. The pages should be numbered consecutively starting with the title page and through the text, reference list, tables, figures and figure legends. The first page of the article should contain: 1) title of article which should represent the subject content of the article, should be brief and specific, 2) name(s) of author(s), full address(es), 3) e-mail ID of the author to whom correspondence should be sent, 4) an abstract, not exceeding 250 words, conveying the main points of the paper and 5) a maximum of five keywords. Follow the format of titles and subtitles as given in the sample paper in the journal website. Click here for a sample paper: Sample paper.pdf

## **Abbreviations**

Abbreviations of units of measurement, biological terms, chemical names and other technical terms in the body of the paper should be used after they are defined clearly in the place they first appear in the text. Abbreviations which would be readily recognized by scientists outside the author's field may be used without definition.

## Tables, Figures and legends

Tables should only include essential data needed to support important points in the text. Each table should be prepared in MS Excel or any compatible format. Tables should be serially numbered with captions and self explanatory material. All figures should be referred to in the text and numbered consecutively (Fig.1, Fig.2, etc.). Histograms, graphs, pie diagrams, etc. should be prepared in MS Excel or any compatible format and the original files attached; photographs and line drawings should be sent as individual image files of high resolution (in .tif, .eps, .jpg format) and the legends provided separately. Figures and Tables may be inserted in the text only for indicating their position but high quality image files should always be sent separately.

References

References should be cited in the text at the appropriate places (e.g. Parameswaran and Liese (1977) or

(Liese et al., 2005). References should include only published materials. The list of references at the end of

the text should be in the following format:
